

Information regarding Perry Mills, case number 06-22017

The debtor:

Mr. Mills personally filed for bankruptcy protection under Chapter 7 of the Bankruptcy Code. Mr. Mills listed approximately 12,000 names which he could owe money to or whom may have a claim against him. Most of the names listed appear to be current or former customers of 21st Century Alarmtek, a company in which Mr. Mills was affiliated with either as an owner, officer or employee. The company is not in bankruptcy. Only Mr. Mills has filed for bankruptcy.

The Notice:

If you have received notice in the mail of this bankruptcy case, Mr. Mills listed you in the documents when he filed bankruptcy with the court. The law requires we provide you notice of his bankruptcy case filing. As required by law, you may be sent additional notices.

Meeting of Creditors - do you need to attend?

The only persons required to attend the meeting is Mr. Mills. Attendance by you is completely voluntary, and will not affect your rights.

Do you need to file a claim?

The decision as to whether you need to file a claim is something you will have to determine. You may want to contact an attorney - that decision is yours to make.

If you determine that you are not owed anything, then you do not need to take any additional action.

If you determine that you are going to file a claim, then please fill out completely the proof of Claim form and submit by the date on the front of the notice of commencement of case. Be sure to follow all the instructions on the bottom of the proof of claim form.

He doesn't owe you anything - how do you get your name removed from the mailing list so that you do not keep receiving mailings from the court?

If you have a choice:

- Do nothing - you will continue to receive notices in the case which may be as few as 1-2 more notices, and you may disregard them; or

- You may write a letter to us, at the **court's** address on the front of the notice of commencement of case, stating that you have no claims against Mr. Mills and request we remove your name from the mailing list (Be sure to include your name and address as it appears on the notice you received - otherwise we will not be able to remove your name).
