**POSITION OVERVIEW:**

The Java Developers will be part of a development team for our nationally-supported CHAP program. CHAP is an application used by Judges and their staff for automating processes within their office such as scheduling court time, managing documents, viewing case information, and note keeping. CHAP is being made available for up to 350 Bankruptcy Court Judges throughout the United States.

The software presently is written in a three-tier architecture using a Delphi Windows client, an ASTA middle tier, and a Linux-based Informix DBMS server. In several phases, members of the development team will be migrating the business logic from the client to a Web services model, rewriting the client in Java, and working on a client for PDA devices.

**QUALIFICATIONS:**

Applicants must have **two years of specialized experience** programming in Java, and they should be familiar with the Linux (or related) operating system.

Preference will be given to applicants with experience programming Web services using Java for database access, and with strong abilities writing and optimizing SQL. It will also be given to applicants who have 3 to 6 months experience using Swing for developing graphical interfaces, two years generalized Java programming or, in the alternative, one year each of Java and C#, and four years combined work experience in a computer or technology field.

**CONDITIONS OF EMPLOYMENT:**

All application information is subject to verification. Appointment to this position is provisional, contingent upon a fingerprint and criminal background check. Employees of the judiciary are "at-will" employees, and are subject to a six-month probationary period. Judiciary employees are required to adhere to the judicial Code of Conduct. Applicants must be citizens of the United States of America or be eligible to work in the United States.

**BENEFITS:**

The United States Bankruptcy Court is part of the judicial branch of the United States government. Court employees are not included in the government's Civil Service classification. They are, however, entitled to the following benefits: paid vacation, paid holidays, sick leave, choice of health plans, federal employees retirement system, life insurance, flexible spending accounts (health and dependent care), long term care options, and the thrift savings plan (the federal government's 401K plan). This position is subject to mandatory direct deposit for payment of net pay.
