GENERAL ORDER 19-001

General Order No. 22-003

Under 11 U.S.C. § 341, the United States Trustee convenes and presides at meetings of creditors. The United States Trustee has indicated an intention to convene meetings of creditors by video conference in bankruptcy cases filed under various Chapters of the Bankruptcy Code. The United States Trustee has further indicated that he will establish protocols for such video appearances. In addition, as technology changes, the protocols may change. Debtors and parties in interest will be given notice of the protocols. Finally, due to the Covid-19 Pandemic, meetings of creditors are being conducted by video conference or telephone in the District of Utah. Consequently, General Order No. 19-001 entitled "In the Matter of Remote Participation in Bankruptcy Court Proceedings – Phase Two" is hereby vacated. Further, notwithstanding Local Rule 2003-1(d), the United States Trustee may convene meetings of creditors by video conference, in person, or by teleconference or such means as the United States Trustee deems appropriate.
