The matter before the Court is the establishment of the End Stay Date¹ pursuant to General Order 25-001, entered on October 8, 2025. The Administrative Office of the U.S. Courts informed this Court that funding for the government had been restored as of November 13, 2025. *See* Continuing Appropriations, Agriculture, Legislative Branch, Military Construction and Veterans Affairs, and Extensions Act, 2026, Pub. L. No. 119-37. Because the Administrative Office has provided this information, the Court deems it unnecessary for an Affected Entity to file the notice contemplated by General Order 25-001 in order for the Court to establish the End Stay Date. Therefore, and pursuant to General Order 25-001,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that:

- The End Stay Date for purposes of General Order 25-001 shall be November 13,
 2025. Affected Entities must carefully review General Order 25-001 to determine the relevant deadlines and procedures outlined therein.
- The requirement that an Affected Entity file the notice contemplated by General Order 25-001 in Miscellaneous Proceeding No. 11-9000 is WAIVED.

¹ Unless otherwise noted, all capitalized terms in this Order shall have the meanings ascribed to them in General Order 25-001.

- 3. Any Affected Entity may request a status conference or seek other relief in any case or adversary proceeding in which it is an interested party if the extended deadlines provided by General Order 25-001 give insufficient time for such Affected Entity to protect its interests or perform required functions before this Court.
- 4. The Clerk of Court shall promptly provide notice of entry of this Order to all Registered Users of this Court's CM/ECF filing system, Felice John Viti, Acting United States Attorney for the District of Utah, and Gregory M. Garvin, Acting United States Trustee for Region 19. The Clerk of Court shall also post a copy of this Order on the Court's website home page and on the page with other General Orders of this Court, as well as at the Orrin G. Hatch United States Courthouse.
